

Declaration of conformity with “European Directive 2000/53/EC relating to end-of life vehicles (ELV)”

The European Union aims to limit the production of waste deriving from vehicles and to intensify the reuse, recycling and other forms of recovery of end-of life vehicles and their components. To achieve these objectives, directive 2000/53/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council on 18 September 2000, regarding end-of life vehicles was issued.

Vehicle and equipment manufacturers may not use hazardous substances such as lead, mercury, hexavalent chromium and cadmium in vehicles placed on the market from 1 July 2003. However, these substances may be used in certain applications if they cannot be avoided (see amending Annex II of Directive 2000/53/EC updated by Directive (EU) 2018/849) according to the following maximum limitations:

- 0,1% by weight of lead (Pb), mercury (Hg) and hexavalent chromium (Cr+6);
- 0,01% by weight of cadmium (Cd).

We, hereby declare that the steels manufactured and placed on the market by O.R.I. MARTIN S.p.A. comply with Directive 2000/53/EC as the substances such as lead, mercury, hexavalent chromium and cadmium:

- are not used or added during our manufacturing processes;
- they may eventually be present only in traces that respect the above limits.

This declaration of conformity is issued under the sole responsibility of ORI MARTIN S.p.A.
